

UniMAP's Success at INPEX

Our researchers have done us proud again with another round of success at the 36th International Exhibition of Inventions of New Techniques and Products (Geneva) and at The Invention and New Products Exhibition 2008 (INPEX). This is a sweet tradition carried over from 2007. In Geneva, three of UniMAP's researchers had exhibited their research results and have won medals for their effort. A gold medal was awarded to Assoc. Prof. Dr. Johari Adnan for his "4-in-1 Sensor Based on Barium Strontium Titanate (BST) Thinfilm". Ms. Naimah Ibrahim and Ms. Alina Rahayu Mohamed were awarded a silver medal each.

INPEX, which is one of the largest invention trade shows in the United States, saw two UniMAP representatives. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Mohd. Zulkali, showcased his "FOSjuice" and "MaltoKarpus" while Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kenneth Sundaraj exhibited his "VR-AKR". There were more than 800 product entries from all over the globe at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center, Pittsburgh, with 50 different categories. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Mohd. Zulkali's 'FOSjuice' bagged a silver medal under the "Participate and Evaluate" category. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kenneth Sundaraj secured 1 gold and 2 silver medals in the Computer Software, Medical and Engineering categories. Furthermore, Dr. Kenneth's 'VR-AKR' was also selected to compete in the "Humanitarian Award" category, which he subsequently won.
