





#### Search

- Portal implementations






















# Clear pathways

- How do I get to that full text quickly and easily?





- BUT CAN USERS FIND WHAT THEY NEED?




# Some techniques


- Loading of records into catalogues

  - Do we need static links to e-resources?








































# Full text local journals

- We are scanning large runs of journals
  - Football Record (Australian Rules Football journal)
  - -(1912-2010)
  - Royal Society of Victoria Proceedings (1855-2010)
  - Royal Historical Society Journal (1911-2010)
  - World War I histories

- What do we call this?





















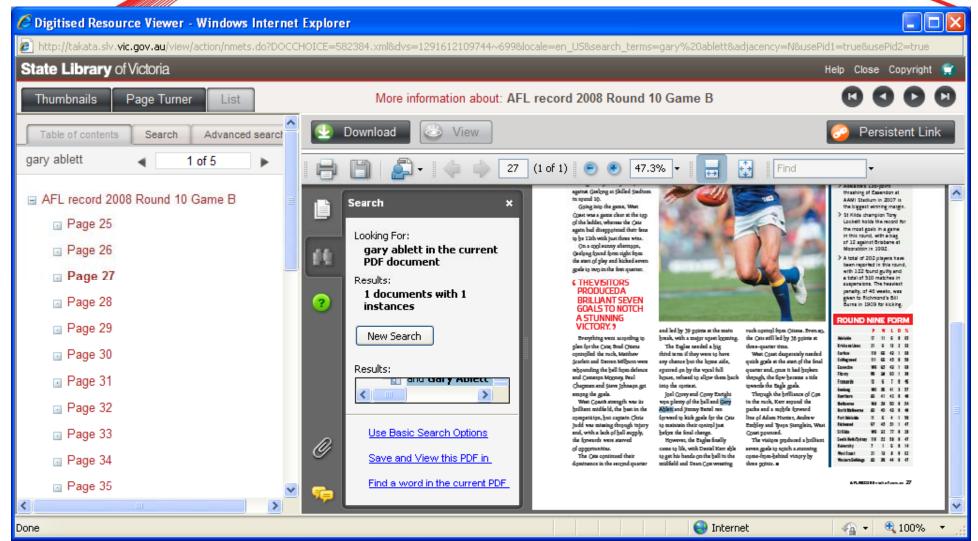




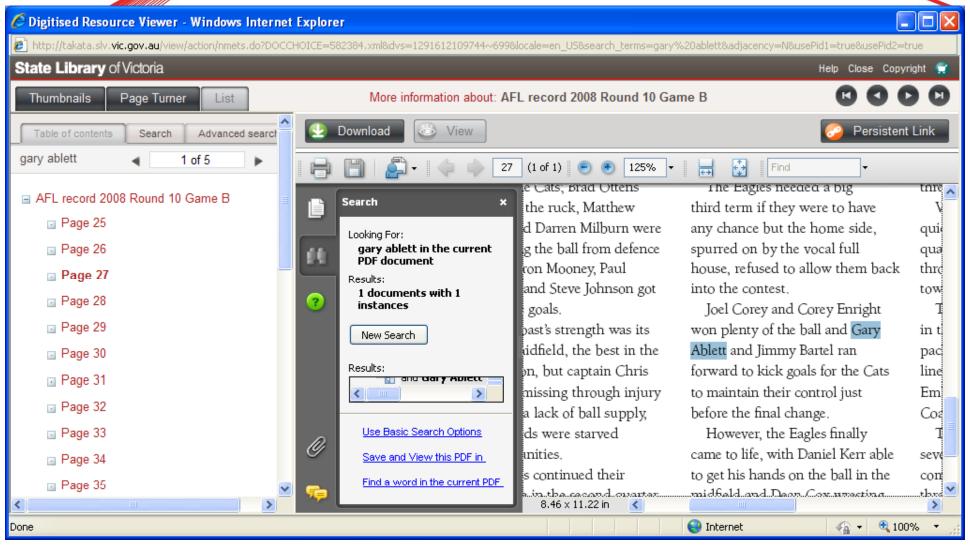








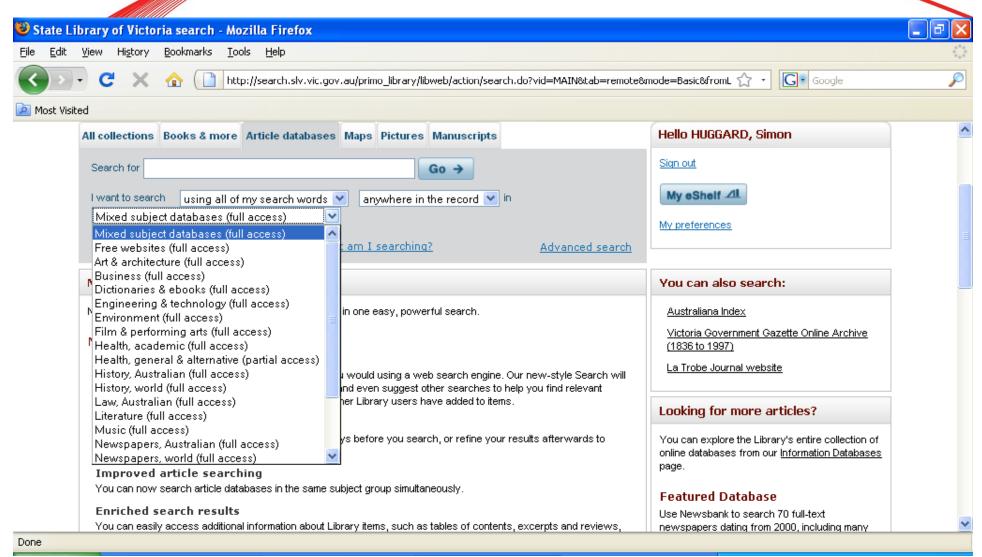




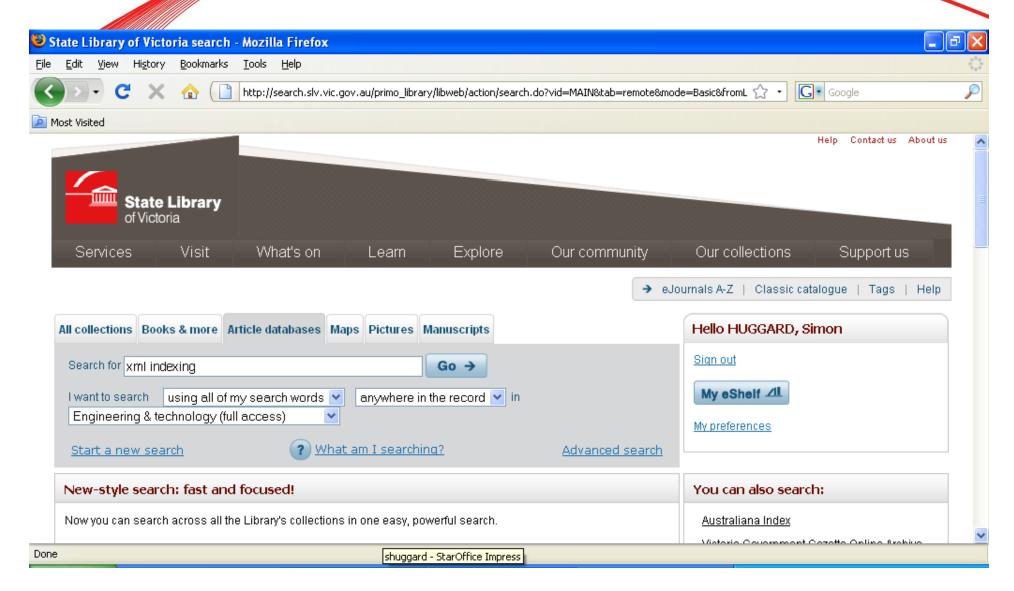

## Conclusions

- Allow full text searching wherever possible (users expect this up front)
- Customisation based on units/teaching
- If you have a lot of pathways (ejournal lists, database lists, etc customise them where relevant)
