UKM OFFERS COOPERATION IN STEM AND HELPING AUTISTIC CHILDREN

Pauh Putra, 12 February – Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) held a visit to Universiti Malaysia Perlis (UniMAP) and the state of Perlis to establish a cooperation between the two universities today.
