

IEM-ILSAS Collaboration on Course Development and Delivery

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The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia (IEM) via its Oil, Gas and Mining Technical Division (OGMTD) has forged a collaboration with TNB Training Institute-ILSAS (Institute Latihan Sultan Ahmad Shah) to deliver ten (10) courses in the calendar year 2007. Each course will be two (2) days in duration.

The collaboration endeavours to leverage on the strength of both IEM and ILSAS, and their Training Collaboration Partners (TCPs) whilst achieving a win-win situation for those involved in the training development and delivery including current and future participants. Within the framework and operations based on ILSAS's training development and delivery IEM and ILSAS will conduct the following courses:

1. Courses based on envisaged industrial needs;
2. Courses' evaluation that may include:
 - a. Evaluation Level 1 (course and trainer);
 - b. Evaluation Level 2 (pre-test and post-test); and
 - c. Evaluation Level 3 (Improvement Behaviour on the Job)

The first launching of the courses took place on 15-16 January 2007 at ILSAS, Bangi Selangor Darul Ehsan with a two-day course titled Welding Process and Equipment. The TCP then was the Welding Institute of Malaysia (WIM) supported by The Welding Institute [TWI South East Asia (SEA)]. The Chairman of OGMTD, Engr. Abd. Razak bin Abu Hurairah and the General Manager of ILSAS, Puan Hajjah Khalidah binti Haron welcomed the participants and delivered brief addresses.





There were seventy five percent (75%) registered participants comprising those from Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH), TNB and other related engineering fraternity such as consultancy, construction, lifting equipment, and oil and gas . The venue of the remaining planned courses is envisaged to be at Training Institute-ILSAS (Institute Latihan Sultan Ahmad Shah).

In the Welding Process and Equipment course, the participants were exposed to the relevant aspects as follows:

1. Classroom Works
2. Practical Works (see enclosed pictures)

After the course, each participant was issued Certificate of Attendance with sixteen (16) Continuing Professional Development (CPD) hours.

It was made to understand that this was the first IEM-ILSAS Collaboration in training development and delivery, and both parties looks forward to more relevant and positive collaboration in other areas that could benefit the nation and industry. ■
