He said this addiction could destroy a person's productivity and affect the family institution.

He said the extract from the ketum leaves, which is popularly known as daun biak, is believed to be a remedy for certain diseases, but the problem arises when people start to misuse it by adding other poisonous substance to it to get high or intoxicated.

Tuanku Syed Faizuddin was speaking at a breaking of fast event at the Kampung Padang Siding mosque on Thursday.

Statistics from the state narcotic unit showed there were 195 arrests made last year for possession of ketum leaves while there were 129 arrests made in the first six months of this year for the same.

"The misuse of ketum leaves could lead to various health problems including insomnia, anorexia and colon cancer," Tuanku Syed Faizuddin said.
